Provisionally Licensed Clinicians

If you are a provisionally licensed clinician serving a consumer who has Medicaid from a county other than Orange, Person or Chatham, you must enroll the Medicaid consumer with the corresponding LME. If you bill OPC for a consumer whose Medicaid is from outside OPC's service area your claim will not get paid by Medicaid. To resolve this issue your agency needs to either have an MOA with the other LME or you can bill "incident to" if you meet the requirements for doing so. For example, if you are a provisionally licensed clinician serving a Medicaid consumer from Durham County, your agency will need to establish an MOA with Durham County for billing for provisionally licensed clinicians and then you will enroll the consumer with the Durham Center. Please note that LMEs do not have to provide this service and if you cannot bill "incident to", you may have to decline to serve consumers from outside of OPC's service area until you are fully licensed.

A+KIDS – Off Label Antipsychotic Monitoring in Children Through Age 17

DMA developed a policy titled *Off Label Antipsychotic Monitoring in Children through Age 17* to gather information about antipsychotic prescribing trends within the child and adolescent Medicaid population of North Carolina. The **A+KIDS** (Antipsychotics-Keeping It Documented for Safety) registry encourages the use of appropriate baseline and follow-up monitoring parameters to document the use of antipsychotic therapy in Medicaid-eligible individuals 0 through 17 years of age and to facilitate the safe and effective use of antipsychotics in this population. This registry will be implemented in phases; the launch of phase one for children 12 years or younger is targeted for April 2011. Billing Submission Deadlines for IPRS PROVIDERS

June 16, 2011 is the last day that OPC can submit IPRS claims to the state to be paid from the state's IPRS dollars for this fiscal year. The deadline for submission of IPRS claims to OPC with service dates **July 1, 2010 through April 30, 2011 is 5 pm on Tuesday, June 14**, in order for the claims to bill to the state on June 16. Providers are strongly encouraged to submit all IPRS services for this date range by Monday, June 6. This will allow time for providers to check the "status" of claims they have submitted, identify any claims that have denied in OPC's business system due to errors, correct those errors, and resubmit the claims before the June 14 deadline. The deadline for submission of IPRS Claims to OPC with service dates **May 1, 2011 through June 30, 2011 services is Tuesday, July 26 at 5pm**. Providers are strongly encouraged to submit these IPRS claims to OPC by Monday, July 18 in order to allow time to check "status" of claims submitted, identify any errors that require correction in order to bill to IPRS, make those corrections, and resubmit the claims prior to the July 26 deadline.

TARS Deadlines for IPRS Services

End dates on TARs for IPRS services must be no later than 6/30/2011. This rule will be in effect until new contracts are issued for Fiscal Year 2011 - 2012. We will let you know as soon as possible when you can start submitting TARS with end dates later than 6/30/11.

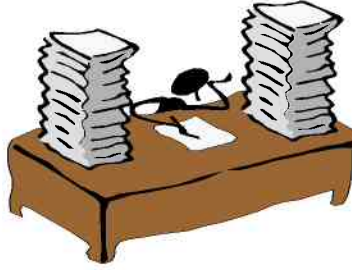
